2021-2025 REPORT

1. **Securing hazardous intersections:** Installed “Watch for Children” signage, added pedestrian signals (Lanark/Lucerne), and speed display signs (Norway).
2. **Redesign of the dangerous Kindersley/Lucerne/Norway corner:** This corner was the most accident-prone in the district. After 4 years of work, I successfully pushed for studies to be launched and work is now planned!
3. **Added speed bumps** to calm traffic (e.g., on St Clare, Kindersley, Waterloo, and Norway).
4. **Installation near Kindersley Park** to reduce excessive speeding in the area.
5. **Demanded redesign studies for Lucerne Avenue** to reduce transit traffic and improve safety and coexistence between drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. This upcoming project must be well supervised, and I hope to actively participate in it to find realistic solutions.
6. **Redesign of Plymouth Avenue** (greening, potential retention basin, etc.) planned for 2026.
7. **Waste and container management** on Plymouth.
8. **Follow-up with car dealerships** to limit test drives through residential streets.
9. **Defended residents’ rights** to be proactively informed and consulted about major projects—especially the development of 1000 Lucerne.

10. **Reduced the density** of the former synagogue/1000 Lucerne development project (from 55 to 47 units) and **requested a FAQ document** following the public consultation.
11. **Chair of the Pension Committee:** Oversaw sound governance of the municipal employee pension plan in TMR. Introduced efficiency measures and proposed improvements in governance processes.
12. **Participated in the Mobility and Safety working group**, to better understand municipal constraints and demand studies and pilot projects to implement innovative solutions.
13. Maintained **proactive and continuous communication with residents** to stay in tune with District 8.

All elected officials collaborated on several key infrastructure projects:

1. **Recreational and Community Centre (REC):** The largest infrastructure project in TMR in decades is finally underway. It's a great team achievement that reflects the constructive contributions of all 9 elected officials.
2. **New bike paths** to improve active transportation infrastructure.
3. **Reconstruction of the fire station**, ensuring modern facilities for both firefighters and Town staff—worthy of TMR's reputation.
4. **Beaumont PPU:** Supported the public consultation process to shape the future vision for this sector.
